Last month's speaker

Gerry Mulligan had lots of insights into the current state of Citrus County. While he's retired from the Chronicle, he remains an active member of several county boards and charities, so he's not slowing down.

He gave us his top 10 challenges and good things in Citrus County. Among the challenges were the BOCC's and city governments' lack of proactive planning for the changes that extending the Suncoast Highway extension will bring. The housing boom that will result will need additional roads and other infrastructure as well as consumer services. Also, since the county was marketed for a long time as a cheap place to retire we are now populated by residents who don't really want to reinvest in their communities. Florida is ranked lowest of all states for the amount of public resources dedicated to mental health, and Citrus County is the lowest in Florida:-(. With the majority of local crime being drug related (heroin or meth), the lack of mental health care means many miss out on care that could have made them into productive citizens.

On the good side, Citrus County's school system still ranks in the top 10 of Florida's 67 counties. 3 Sisters Springs is one of the top wildlife refuges in the US. Residents in the county are caring and generous. \$75K was donated to help a woman who ended up raising her grandkids after her daughter died of cancer. \$400K has been raised for the animal shelter. 3 Sisters Springs was going to become a housing development but locals raised enough money to buy the land for the refuge. Still, civic-mindedness seems to be an older person's thing and we need to get the next generations involved.

Citrus County Solid Waste Assessment



Earlier this year you received a letter from the county regarding an increase in your Ad Valorem assessment for Solid Waste. This is a \$27 per household assessment (up \$2 from the previous \$25) that will go to the Solid Waste Division. Many people wondered what the assessment is for.

Per their website, "The Division operates as an enterprise fund, where revenues are generated by user fees charged at the landfill. A Solid Waste assessment on each residential unit in the County (\$27 per year), and a fee charged to businesses with waste disposal service allows the County to provide non-revenue generating services such as Bulky Item disposal, Household Hazardous Waste Programs, County-wide Solid Waste Code Enforcement and Litter Pick-up, Adopt-a-Highway and Snag-n-Bag Aquatic Litter Programs, Future Solid Waste Planning, Construction and Capital Projects."

Anonymous Deed Restriction violation or other complaints will no longer be received. All complaints must include resident's name and address to ensure the complainant is a Pine Ridge resident.

Board approved purchase of an upgraded laptop computer for the Manager, price NTE \$2000.

An Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) will be purchased and installed in the Community Center. The device will be donated to the Civic Association who will arrange training sessions. Note, training is not necessary, as the device is fully automatic with pictures and voice prompts for the user. There is no way for a shock to be administered manually, and the device will administer a shock only if it detects a shockable heart rhythm in the patient.

Acquired permits to relocate and replace the damaged Pine Ridge Estates sign at 486. The new sign will be installed farther back to avoid future damage. Still waiting to receive the County's permit for closing parts of the road during the work.
