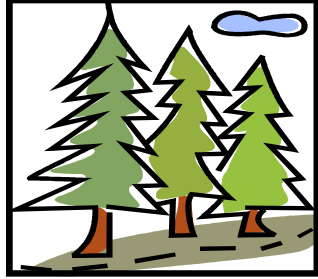

Citrus County Water Resources

It's Springtime which means we're getting rain. Be sure your irrigation system's rain sensor is working so you don't waste money or water from our aquifer.

Following are a few of the Citrus BOCC water restrictions for our area. See [www.https://tinyurl.com/WaterSched](https://tinyurl.com/WaterSched) for the full list.

- Landscape irrigation is limited to one day per week
- Irrigation is only allowed on a specific day of the week based on the last number of the address.
- All landscape irrigation is **prohibited** between 10am and 4pm to reduce evaporation.
- Hand watering and micro-irrigation of plants (other than lawns) can be done any day before 10am or after 4pm.
- All wasteful and unnecessary water use is prohibited. For example, irrigating within 12 hours of receiving $\frac{3}{4}$ " of rain, irrigating with a broken sprinkler head/part or allowing water to flow from a hose without a nozzle.
- All new plant material qualifies for additional watering. However, how watering is accomplished is restricted.

A user may irrigate established lawns and landscaping 12-10am or 4-11:59pm (not both) on the allowable day.

- Detective James West, CCSO reminded the audience that their best defense against car theft or vandalism is to lock your doors.
- Two “Meet the Candidates” meetings were held. One during the day, and the other in the evening.
- Board approved expenses and bids to resurface the pool table, reseal the parking lot, and purchase a gate lock mechanism for the dog run.
- Quotes for relining the lower tennis courts to accommodate both tennis and pickleball are being obtained.
- Board approved sending demand letters and suspending voting and use rights for property owners whose accounts are delinquent as of April 1, 2022.
- Board directed the Roads Committee to create and publish a survey on the PRPOA website. Responses will be presented at the next Board meeting
- Board also held two special Board meetings to discuss potential changes to the By-Laws
